

October 25, 2020 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Gospel – Adapted from Mark 10:46-52

Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd when Bartimaeus, a blind man, who was sitting by the roadside begging, heard it was Jesus of Nazareth and cried out, "Jesus, son of David, have mercy on me." The people told him to be quiet, but he just called out more, "Son of David, have mercy on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man and told him, "Have courage. Get up, Jesus is calling you." He threw aside his coat, jumped up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately the man received his sight and followed Jesus.



2 Reflection

"Immediately the man received his sight and followed Jesus." Those are the words at the end of today's Gospel, and they are the key to the whole passage. In today's Gospel, a blind man, Bartimaeus, calls out to Jesus. Even though the people tell him to be quiet, he continues calling out to Jesus, and Jesus calls him, and asks him what he wants.

"Master, I want to see." Bartimaeus believes that Jesus can heal him. Jesus tells Bartimaeus what He tells many people that He heals: "Your faith has saved you." This is true in more ways than one for Bartimaeus. Yes, he received his eyesight, but he received even more. Jesus told Bartimaeus to go on his way. After getting his eyesight, Bartimaeus had a choice. Which way would he go?

"Immediately the man received his sight and followed Jesus." Bartimaeus chose to follow Jesus. He received his sight. He was able to see who Jesus is, and that He is the one who should be followed. That is the greater sight Bartimaeus received. He was able to see the Truth, and He chose to follow Him.

3 Discussion Questions

Do you recognize the truth about Jesus? Have you made your choice, like Bartimaeus, to follow Him?

Is there anything in your life that you think you may not be seeing clearly? Anything you are having trouble understanding? Ask Jesus to help you see.
