Memory Work (Baltimore Catechism):

23. Can we know God in any other way than by our natural reason?

Besides knowing God by our natural reason, we can also know Him from supernatural revelation, that is, from the truths found in Sacred Scripture and in Tradition, which God Himself has revealed to us.

23A. What do we mean when we say that God has revealed these truths to us?

When we say that God has revealed these truths to us we mean that He has made them known to certain persons, to be announced to their fellow men as the word of God..

23B. What is the Bible?

The Bible is the written word of God, committed to His Church for the instruction and sanctification of mankind.

Review:

Vocabulary

- Revelation – Those truths that God has revealed to us; His communication of Himself, most fully in Jesus Christ
- Bible – The holy book, given to us, containing God's Word
- Inspiration – The gift of the Holy Spirit that allowed the human authors of the Bible to write what God wants us to receive, His Word, without error
- Tradition – God's revelation passed on to the Church through the apostles but not written in the Bible

1) What does it mean that God is eternal?

He has no beginning; He has always existed

2) How many books are in the Bible?

73 – 46 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament
