Review:

Vocabulary

- Christmas – The celebration of Jesus' birth on December 25.
- Bethlehem – The town where Jesus was born
- Magi – Three wisemen from the East who were led to the Baby Jesus by a star

1) Where was Jesus born?

Bethlehem

2) What visitors did the Baby Jesus receive, shortly after His birth?

Shepherds and wise men from the East (the Magi)

Discussion Question:

What would it have been like to have been one of the shepherds who received the message from the angels and then visited the newborn Baby Jesus? (see Luke 2:1-20).

Activity:
